Background

Changed Terms

#### • CAULKING / SEALANT

- Previous
  - Semi or slow-drying plastic material used to fill crevices or seal joints.
- New
  - Semi-rigid material that is used to fill cracks, seams and joints to eliminate water or air leaks. Material can be sprayed, squeezed or brushed on.

# New Terms

- CAVITY WAX
  - A non-hardening material that is applied to interior surfaces such a doors, hoods, deck lids and rocker panels to seal out moisture.

# New Terms

#### • CENTERLINE BOW

A change in the center section where the vehicle is out of tolerance to the vehicle center line .

Changed Terms

### • DIAMOND CONDITION

- Previous
  - Frame misalignment resulting from a heavy impact on the corner of either side rail of the frame that is sufficient to push the side rail back. As a result the cross members are pushed out of a right angle with the side rail.
- New
  - One side of the vehicle has moved rearward causing the vehicle/frame to move out of square.

## • GRAVEL GUARD

 A semi flexible materials applied to the outer lower portions of fenders, rocker panels, doors and quarter panels to reduce damage to e-coat from impact from rocks and stones.

New Terms

Changed Terms

### MASH CONDITION

#### - Previous

• Type of frame damage in which a portion of the side rail is bent down causing buckles to be formed on the underside .

#### - New

• A shortness of length from factory specifications .
